ADDITIONAL PRESENTATIONS

The following are general presentations written and held by Tracey Turner at various locations in the Mid-Atlantic region between 1999 and present. Additional details and particular dates and locations will be provided upon request.

Parenting Basics on Attachment. A seminar designed to instruct on parenting techniques, bonding and attachment issues, family problem solving and conflict resolution. General overview and methods, as well as an introduction to Dance Movement Therapy, Storytelling and snuggling as therapeutic tools in these situations.

Re-Parenting History. A therapeutic eight-week class designed to understand how our experiences of being parented affect how we parent our children, relationships and life.

Parenting the Difficult Child. A seminar designed around the difficult child and the parenting needs of these children. Focus is on the developing of skills by the parent to help cope with anticipated problems.

Problems and solutions for the Female Perpetrator. A two-day working seminar concerned with the particular problems of the female perpetrator, the identification, anticipation, and the resolution of these problems. In coordination with the National Institute of Mental Health.

National Sex Offender Conference. A one-day seminar given in conjunction with the Sex Offender Program Action Committee.
